Wildlife Trust – Invasive Plants

Himalayan Balsam and is now getting into full flower. By the end of August, the flowers will die off and turn to seed pods. When mature the seed pods break open and spread their seed over a wide area helped by the wind. Each plant can produce up to 2500 seeds! I am looking into an important role for Rotary where we help by photographing and reporting to your local Wildlife Trust the locations where the weed exists. This will enable plans to be made for the future for trying to reduce it.



Japanese Knotweed, In recent cut-backs aid for people whose land has been invaded by this weed has been reduced or even stopped, putting the whole responsibility for its eradication on the landowner. This weed can demolish buildings and its root system grows very rapidly. Any sighting of this should be notified to your Local Authority.
