Rotary International Youth Camp – 11 July 2015 to 25 July 2015

Rotarians in Rotary District 1260, which covers the counties to the north-west of London, are arranging a camp for young people (typical age range 15 to 17) drawn from more than twelve different countries in Europe. This is organised as an official programme of Rotary International and aims to meet the Fourth Object of Rotary – "the advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace". Rotary Districts throughout Europe offer more than 100 such camps each year.

Up to 20 young people will travel to England and spend the first week in the homes of individual Rotarians, learning about our country, our language and our culture. In week two, the young people will all meet together at Youth Hostel accommodation. During this week they will have the opportunity to participate in various water-sports and other activities, which are organised by a professional team under the auspices of Hertfordshire County Council. There are also plans for outings to London and to Cambridge. A copy of the draft programme is attached. The cost of these activities is already pre-paid.

Rotarians will meet participants at the point of arrival in the UK, and deliver them to pre-arranged addresses and will meet all food and accommodation costs. At the end of the camp, Rotarians will return the participants to their point of departure from the UK.
