Colin McInnes UNESCO Professor of HIV/AIDS and Health Security in Africa Director of Research Excellence, Aberystwyth University



Colin McInnes is UNESCO Professor of HIV/AIDS and Health Security in Africa, and Aberystwyth University's Director of Research Excellence.

His research interests cover many aspects of global health and International Relations, but especially the security dimensions of HIV and AIDS, global health governance and global health diplomacy.

He has published widely on global health issues and is currently editing the Oxford Handbook of Global Health Politics.

Colin was formerly Head of the Department of International Politics at Aberystwyth, the first department of its kind in the world; and Dean of Postgraduate Studies at Aberystwyth.

He was a lecturer in the Department of War Studies, The Royal Military Academy Sandhurst; Visiting Research Fellow at King's College London; and Special Adviser to the House of Commons Defence Committee.

He was Chair of the British International Studies Association; member of WHO's expert group on Global Health Diplomacy; and Director of the UK Research Councils' Security Research Forum.

He sits on a range of advisory panels and editorial boards, including advising the InterAction Council – a group of 40 former heads of state including Bill Clinton and John Major – on global health security.

He is Vice Chair of the UK National Commission for UNESCO, a Fellow of the Academy of Social Sciences, Fellow of the Royal Society for the Arts and in December 2017 was the first recipient of the Special Achievement Award at the Wales Social Research Awards.
