Appointed Rotary International Director for 2015-2017, he served his second year on the Board he is Chairman of the RI Administration Committee, Vice Chair of the RI Committee Selection Task Force, member of the RI Executive and Service above Self committee's and Liaison Director to both the Election Review and Youth Exchange Committee.

This year he is Chairman of the RI Election Review Committee and the RI Committee Selection 2018 Task Force and organising Chairman of the 2018 Presidential Peacebuilding Conference in Coventry Peter received the RI "Service above Self" award for among other things his work for the English Disabled Sports Team Championships which he founded in 1982 and is still Chairman of the Trustees.
